## 2010 FIBA Rule Changes with BCBOA Applications

### EQUIPMENT

Compression sleeves and stockings are permitted (same colour as shirt/shorts).

T-shirts shall be permitted but must be the same colour as the team jersey.

No visible jewelery shall be permitted.

Piercings of any kind are not permitted to be worn or covered with tape.

### PLAYING TIME

Begins when, during the opening toss, the ball leaves the officials hands, and to begin each subsequent period, when it is at the disposal of the thrower-in.

The interval between quarters and between any overtime period will be one minute.

The half-time interval will be ten minutes.

Seniors will play 10 minute quarters & 5 minute overtime periods.

Juniors (& lower) will play 8 minute quarters & 3 minute overtime periods.

### STATUS OF THE BALL

During the opening toss, the ball becomes live when it leaves the officials hands.

### LAST SECOND SHOT

In each period, the game clock must indicate 0:00.3 (3 tenths of a second) or more for a player to secure control of the ball on a throw-in, or on a rebound after the last or only free throw, in order to attempt a shot for a field goal.

If the game clock indicates 0:00.2 or 0:00.1, the ball must be tapped or directly dunked to be considered a valid attempt.

### LAST 2 MINUTES

When the team entitled to a throw-in in their back-court takes a time-out, the ball will be advanced to the throw-in line (28 feet from the base-line) in its front-court, opposite the team bench area.

### 8/10-SECOND RULE

The back-court count starts as soon as any player in the playing court touches or is touched by the ball in the back-court and the team taking the throw-in remains in control of the ball.

### BALL IN THE FRONT-COURT

With the exception of a dribbler, the ball is considered to be in the front-court when it touches or is legally touched by an offensive player who's both feet are in contact with, or last contacted the front-court.

A dribbler must also cause the ball to contact the front-court before front-court status will apply.

## **24/30-SECOND RULE**

On a throw-in, the shot clock starts as soon as the ball touches or is touched by any player on the playing surface and the team taking the throw-in remains in control of the ball.

If the game is **stopped** by an official:

- For a foul or violation (not for the ball having gone out-of-bounds) by the team not in control of the ball,
- For any valid reason by the team not in control of the ball,
- For any valid reason not connected with either team,

Possession of the ball shall be awarded to the same team that previously had control of the ball.

If the throw-in is administered in the back-court, the twenty-four (24/30) second clock shall be reset to twenty-four/thirty (24/30) seconds.

If the throw-in is administered in the front-court, the twenty-four (24/30) second clock shall be reset as follows:

- If fourteen (14) seconds or more is displayed on the shot clock at the time when the game was stopped, the shot clock shall not be reset, but remain where it is.
- If thirteen (13) seconds or less is displayed on the shot clock at the time when the game was stopped, the shot clock shall be reset to fourteen (14) seconds.

## **UNSPORTSMANLIKE FOUL**

During the last two (2) minutes of the 4th period, as well as during the last two (2) minutes of each extra period, and while the ball is out-of-bounds for a throw-in and still in the hands of the official or the thrower-in, any defensive contact foul will be called an unsportsmanlike foul.

## **NOISEMAKERS**

Aerosol air horns, loud speakers (megaphones), whistles, and laser pointers must not be allowed into the playing facility.

If such a device is noticed during a game, the game shall be stopped (at the appropriate time) and it will be the sole responsibility of the home team administration, or game director (if applicable) to immediately confiscate the device.

There shall be no penalty sanctioned.

## **FORFEIT**

It is the sole responsibility of the Head Coach to ensure that he/she has signed the score-sheet prior to the start of the game and has included the name of one only Assistant Coach on the score-sheet.

If there is no Assistant Coach's name on the score-sheet, no one may be added to the score-sheet, or will be recognized as an Assistant Coach.

In the event that the Head Coach is ejected, the Assistant Coach (if named on the score-sheet) will take over Coaching duties. If there is no Assistant Coach named on the score-sheet, or when both the Head Coach and the named Assistant Coach have been ejected, the game will be forfeited.

## **KEY**

The rectangular NCAA Key will be used, unless the NCAA key markings are not present; in which case, those key markings that do exist will be used.

## **FREE-THROW VIOLATIONS**

Art. 43.3.3 If, during a final or only unsuccessful free-throw, a violation is committed both teams (including the free thrower) – a jump ball situation occurs.

# Questions

## LAST SECOND SHOT

Question 1:

With 0:00.2 second left on the game clock, A2 secures control of A1's throw-in pass and releases a try for goal before the buzzer sounds to end the period. While the ball is in the air, the buzzer sounds and then the ball enters the basket. Shall the basket count?

*Answer: No. Tap or immediate dunk!*

Question 2:

With 0:00.2 second left on the game clock, A2 taps A1's throw-in pass toward the basket. While the ball is in the air, the buzzer sounds and then the ball enters the basket. Shall the basket count?

*Answer: Yes. Tap or immediate dunk!*

## LAST 2 MINUTES

Question 3:

With 1:45 left to play in the 4th period, defender B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1 who is dribbling the ball in Team A's back-court. Team A is granted a time-out. After the 2 free throws awarded to A1, shall the Team A throw-in be taken at mid-court, straddling the line?

*Answer: No. The ball is advanced to the throw-in line because the offensive team's time-out.*

## 8/10 - SECOND RULE

Question 4:

Offensive player A1's throw-in pass from Team A's back court is touched but not controlled by teammate A2 and the ball bounces freely on the floor. Shall the official start an 8/10 - second count immediately?

*Answer: Yes. Whenever the throw-in touches any in-bounds player.*

Question 5:

Offensive player A1's throw-in pass from Team A's back-court is deflected by defender B1 and the ball bounces freely on the floor. Shall the official start an 8/10 - second count immediately?

*Answer: Yes. The back-court count starts when the ball touches any in-bounds player.*

Question 6:

Offensive player A1's throw-in pass from Team A's back-court touches an in-bounds official and the ball bounces freely on the floor. Shall the official start an 8/10 - second count immediately?

*Answer: No. The ball must touch an in-bounds player ... the official is considered part of the playing surface.*

## BALL IN THE FRONT COURT

Question 7:

Offensive player A1, who is straddling the mid-court line, receives a pass from teammate A2 from Team A's back-court. A1 passes the ball back to A2 who is still in Team A's back-court. Is this legal?

*Answer: Yes. Both feet, and if a dribbler, the ball must contact the front-court.*

Question 8:

Offensive player A1, who is straddling the mid-court line, receives a pass from A2 from Team A's back-court. A1 pivots into Team A's back-court. Is this a violation?

*Answer: No. The offensive player must have both feet, and if a dribbler, the ball contact the front-court.*

Question 9:

Offensive player A1, who is straddling the mid-court line, receives a pass from teammate A2 from Team A's back-court. A1 while still straddling the line dribbles the ball. Is this legal?

*Answer: Yes. Both feet are not in contact with the front-court.*

Question 10:

Offensive player A1, who is straddling the mid-court line, receives a pass from teammate A2 from Team A's back-court. A1 then passes to A3 who is also straddling the mid-court line. Is this legal?

*Answer: Yes. Neither player has had both feet in contact with the front-court.*

Question 11:

Offensive player A1, who is straddling the mid-court line, receives a pass from teammate A2 from Team A's back-court. A1 then passes to A3 who jumps from Team A's front-court, catches A1's pass while airborne and lands straddling the mid-court line. Is this a violation?

*Answer: Yes. A3 has front-court status, because both feet had last contacted the front-court.*

## **24/30 - SECOND RULE**

Question 12:

After a Team B basket, offensive player A1's throw-in pass is deflected by B1 and then deflected by teammate A2. While no player has gained control of the ball on the court, should the 24/30 - second device be started?

*Answer: Yes.*

Question 13:

With 1:45 left to play in the 4th period, offensive player A1 is dribbling the ball in Team A's back-court for 5 seconds when defender B1 deliberately deflects the ball with his foot or leg? The shot clock shows 19 seconds. Team A is granted a time-out. When play resumes with a Team A throw-in at the throw-in line, shall the shot clock be reset to 24/30?

*Answer: No. When a throw-in occurs in the front-court, the shot clock is not reset to 24/30.*

Question 14:

A1 is dribbling the ball in Team A's front-court when B1 fouls A1? The shot clock shows 18 seconds. When play resumes with a Team A throw-in, shall the shot clock be reset to 24/30?

*Answer: No. When a non-shooting foul is called in the front-court, the shot clock shall remain at 18 seconds. If less than 14 seconds, the shot clock would be reset to 14 seconds.*

Question 15:

A1 is dribbling the ball in Team A's front-court when B1 deflects the ball which goes out of bounds in Team A's back-court? The shot clock shows 4 seconds. When play resumes with a Team A throw-in, shall the shot clock be reset to 24/30?

*Answer: No. When a defender causes the ball to go out-of-bounds, the shot clock is never reset.*

Question 16:

A1 is dribbling the ball in Team A's front-court, when play is stopped because of an injury to A2. The shot clock shows 10 seconds. When play resumes with a Team A throw-in, shall the shot clock be reset to 14?

*Answer: No. The clock would only be reset to 14 if the game was stopped for an defenders injury. The clock remains at 10 seconds.*

Question 17:

A1 is dribbling the ball in Team A's back-court when B2 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A2. The shot clock shows 19 seconds. When play resumes with a Team A throw-in straddling the mid-court line after A2's free throws, shall the shot clock be reset to 24/30?

*Answer: Yes. The shot clock shall be reset on any technical, unsportsmanlike or disqualifying foul.*

Question 18:

With Team A in control of the ball and 5 seconds left on the shot clock, A1 and B1 are called for a double foul in Team B's restricted area? When play resumes with a Team A throw-in in Team A's front-court, shall the shot clock be reset to 14?

*Answer: No. The shot clock shall remain at 5 seconds.*

## **UNSPORTSMANLIKE FOUL**

Question 19:

With 1:29 to play in the 2nd period and the ball at the disposal of A1 for a throw-in, defender B2 causes contact with in-bounds player A2 and a foul is called. Shall the foul be judged unsportsmanlike?

*Answer: No. Only in the final 2 minutes of the 4th period or the final 2 minutes of any extra period.*

## **FREE-THROW VIOLATIONS**

Question: 20

On the final free throw attempt by free-thrower A1, B5 enters the 2-point area prior to the release of free throw. The attempt by A1 misses the ring.

*Ruling: double violation ... jump ball AP arrow throw-in to be administered at the free-throw line extended.*

Question: 21

During the final free throw, B2 enters the lane prior to the release of A1's shot. A1 then releases the final free throw but the ball misses the ring.

*Ruling: double violation, jump ball AP arrow throw-in to be administered at the free-throw line extended.*
