Rule	Interpretation
Throw-In Line	The new throw-in lines are the only new court lines that we are using. (Even to the top of the 3-point line, opposite scorers table.)
Compression Sleeves and Stockings	These items are allowed, but must be the same color as the shorts and/or shirts.
Interval of Play	The interval of play ends when the ball is tossed or is at the disposal of the thrower-in.
Status of the Ball	The ball is alive when it leaves the hand(s) of the referee on a jump ball.
Last Second Shot	The 3 tenths of a second interpretation applies on catch and release of a shot from a throw-in or on the rebound of a final free throw.
Last 2 minutes of 4th Quarter or Extra period	If the team entitled to a backcourt throw in in the last 2 minutes of the 4 th quarter or extra period takes a time-out, the subsequent throw-in is moved to the front court to the “new” throw-in line. Throw-in is front court-only.
Ball in the Front Court	The ball is in the front court once it touches or is legally touched by an offensive player who has both feet (any portion) in contact with his front court.
Unsportsmanlike Foul	During the last 2 minutes of the 4 th period (or 2 nd half) or the last 2 minutes of any extra period and the ball is out-of-bounds for a throw in and still in the hands of the official or already at the disposal of the thrower-in and a defensive team player commits a contact foul, this foul shall be ruled unsportsmanlike.
8 second Rule	The 8 second count starts as soon as the ball touches or is touched by “any” player in the backcourt and the team taking the throw-in remains in control of the ball.
24 second Rule	<p>On a throw in the 24 second count starts as soon as the ball touches or is touched by “any” player on the court and the team taking the throw-in remains in control of the ball. (Does not apply to rebounds because there is no team control until you have player control)</p> <hr/> <p>If the game is stopped by an official for a foul, violation (other than ball out of bounds) by the team not in control of the ball, or for any valid reason not connected to either team, the game shall be restarted in the following manner: Possession of the ball shall be awarded to the same team that previously had control of the ball. If the ball was in the backcourt when the foul or violation occurred, the 24 second clock shall be reset to 24. Once the ball is in the frontcourt and 14 or more seconds are displayed then the 24 second clock will not be reset. If fewer than 14 seconds are displayed then the 24 second clock shall be reset to 14 seconds.</p>
